



# STUDENT DRESS CODE

# Rationale

The school uniform is determined by the Principal in accordance with the Education Act 2006 and in consultation with teachers, students and parents.

The school uniform is designed to be safe and comfortable for students and affordable for all families.

The wearing of the school uniform:

- allows staff to easily identify students and non-students at school and in the community;
- eliminates distraction of competition in fashion;
- minimises visible evidence of economic and social differences;
- fosters a sense of belonging, school spirit and pride; and
- promotes a positive school image in the community.

## Application

This dress code applies to students when:

- attending or representing the school.
- travelling to and from school.
- engaging in school activities out of school hours.

## Formal School Uniform

School leaders and other students may be required to wear the formal school uniform for special events.

Students are required to wear:

- blazer.
- girls formal school shirt with school logo embroidered on pocket.
- boys plain white collared dress shirt. This shirt must be tucked in.
- tie.
- plain black dress pants/skirt. Length must reach students fingertips when standing up straight and hands are down by their side as a minimum.
- plain black shoes.
- white or black short sport socks.

The following items are available for loan from the school library:

- blazer.
- girls formal shirt.
- tie.

# Sport Uniform

Students may wear the school sport uniform every day.

Students are required to wear:

- years 7, 8 and 9 junior polo with school logo.
- years 10, 11 and 12 senior polo with school logo.
- year 12 senior shirt.
- plain black shorts/skorts/skirts. Length must reach students fingertips when standing up straight and hands are down by their side as a minimum.
- white or black short sport socks.

School sport shirts and shorts may be purchased from Heilbronn's Mensland.

Students may wear a black or royal blue long sleeve undershirt for cultural reasons.



Students may not wear:

- leggings.
- denim jeans.

Students are permitted to wear specialised athletic wear to participate in some events. Students are required to wear their sport uniform whilst travelling to and from the venue. Students may change in to and out of athletic wear at the venue.

# Winter Uniform

Students may wear:

- school jumper
- school jacket
- black tracksuit pants.
- black dress pants.
- plain white singlet/undershirt. This must not be visible under the school shirt.

Students may not wear:

- stockings.
- leggings.
- denim jeans.
- scarves.
- gloves.

# Year 12

Students are able to wear a school senior jersey. Personalisation of the jersey by the inclusion of surnames is compulsory. Nicknames and blank spaces are not permitted.

# School Band Uniform

Students involved in the Instrumental Music Program's ensembles, are required to wear the school band uniform for formal events and competitions.

Students are required to provide and wear:

- white collared dress shirt
- plain black dress pants/skirt. Length must reach students fingertips when standing up straight and hands are down by their side as a minimum.
- black closed in shoes. Dress shoes are preferred.
- black socks (boys).

Students are also required to wear:

- blue vest.
- long tie.

These items are provided by the school.

# Cattle Team Uniform

Students involved in the Cattle Team, are required to wear the cattle team uniform for formal events and competitions.

Students are required to provide and wear:

- blue vest with school logo.
- white long sleeve collared dress shirt.
- cream jeans.
- boots.
- broad brimmed hat.

Students are also required to wear:

- yellow neck tie.
- school blazer.

These items are provided by the school.



## Free Dress Day

Students are required to wear:

- closed in shoes
- sun safe shirts.
- pants/shorts/skirts where the length reaches students fingertips when standing up straight and hands are down by their side as a minimum.

Students may not wear:

- singlets
- clothing with offensive slogans.



## Shoes

Students are required to wear closed in shoes for workplace health and safety. Ballet flats and/or slip on shoes are not permitted.

In exceptional circumstances, a student who presents at school in unsafe footwear with a note of explanation or other contact from a parent/carer will be supervised, for a limited period, in a non-classroom environment.

If a student arrives at school in unsafe footwear without notification from a parent/carer, the student will be detained by administration staff until their parent/carer has been contacted and the acquisition of safe footwear is obtained.

#### Hat

Students are issued a hat upon enrolment by the P&C. Additional hats can be purchased at the school office.

Students are required to wear a school hat when outside in the sun. This includes timetabled Health and Physical Education lessons and lunchtime activities.



Students may not wear:

any other hat or cap.

#### Hair

Students are required to have natural coloured hair. Colours such as blue, red, green, etc. are not permitted.

Students must keep their hair neat and tidy.



Students may not wear:

• beanies.

• bandannas.

Head Scarves, Hijabs and Burkas

- Students may wear black and navy blue only.
- Adornments are not permitted.

## Cosmetics

Students may wear:

- light and natural coloured foundation.
- light and natural coloured lip gloss.

Students may not wear:

- eye make-up.
- lipstick.
- false nails.
- nail polish.

Students may be required to remove excessive make-up.

## Jewellery

Students may wear:

- a watch.
- a medic alert identification.
- two plain small studs and/or sleepers in ears.
- body piercings. All body piercings must be clear and lie flat to the skin. Students may be asked to tape over a body piercing.

Students may not wear:

- necklaces.
- anklets.
- rings.
- spacers.

At times, students may be required to remove their jewellery for workplace health and safety.

Jewellery is brought to school at the students own risk. The school does not accept any responsibility for loss or theft.

## Tattoos

## Consequences

- contact with parents/carers.
- a lunch time detention in accordance with the school's detention policy.
- withdrawal from attending a activity or event.
